Houseplants will be judged on flowering, flower color, form, development, plant color, shape, cleanliness, freedom of insect or disease damage and distinctiveness

Annual and perennial exhibits will be judged on stem, foliage and flower.

Arrangements will be judged on color, harmony, design, balance, proportion, condition, stability of material and relation to container distinction and originality.
